Since 1996, DNDA has collaborated with local creatives and organizers to develop programs that engage and sustain a dynamic Delridge. Today, DNDA consists of seven affordable housing properties, Youngstown Cultural Arts Center and, since merging in 2016, Nature Consortium.

The historic Youngstown Cultural Arts Center hosts over 50,000 guests annually. Youngstown houses six other nonprofit organizations, provides 36 live-work spaces for low-income artists, and offers public rental space.
